DIY:

Visually inspect the outside of your home for loose gutters, damaged shingles or roofing, and cracks or damage in your foundation and chimney. Replace internal air filters.

- Vacuum the coils on your refrigerator.
- Clean the vent over your stove.
- Patch any damaged calking around sinks, tubs and toilets.

For the Pros:

Have a qualified heating and cooling contractor clean and service your outside air conditioning unit for improved efficiency.

Have a roofer inspect the flashing around vents, skylights and chimneys. Have your chimney inspected by a certified professional.

Check for frozen pipe damage by turning on your outside spigot and holding your thumb over the spout. If you can stop the flow of water, there is likely damage to a pipe inside your home, requiring the attention of a professional plumber.

If you're noticing standing water near your home, contact a professional experience in positive drainage solutions.

With the doorknob, the door to the Price Family's bathroom was just inches too narrow for their son's wheelchair to pass through easily.

SOLUTION:

Create a recess in the wall for the doorknob.



WHAT WE DID:

By insetting a ceramic toilet paper holder into the wall, the doorknob tucks away giving two additional inches of space in the doorway without losing the clean, tiled aesthetic. In addition to other changes to the bathroom, including grab bars and an open shower space with seating, the bathroom has become accessible and easyto-navigate.
