Custom cabinetry can create a multi-purpose space to simplify household chores, store sports gear and school supplies, keep daily items within reach, and even function as a grooming center for your family pet.

But custom cabinetry design can turn this space into a workshop, tool shed, garden nursery, extra storage space, shelter for the family car, or all of the above. laundry room

Custom cabinetry is essential in designing a functional laundry room. A lot of homeowners choose front loading washers and dryers for energy-efficiency and accessibility. In order to make the most of this limited space, we designed a custom cabinet to sit between the two units. This narrow cabinet has two pull-out drawers to store commonly-used laundry supplies within reach for daily chores. The cabinet is topped with a durable solid surface for use to fold clothes or temporarily place clothing hampers. It also sits on casters so it can be easily moved to clean or perform maintenance on the washer and dryer.



-message center

We made the most out of the end of this kitchen cabinet by creating a message center to store keys, mail, bills and important information. A dry erase board on the inside of the door provides a space for family notes and reminders. Everything is tucked out of sight, but totally within reach as a center of information.



Showers need extra storage to store all of our toiletries. This locker cabinet is recessed into the wall to provide almost six feet of storage in an attractive, mess-free manner.





kitchen

Because the kitchen is a hub of activity in the home, this space needs to serve multiple purposes. We created a wall of cabinets to serve as a place to store kitchen appliances, a pantry for dry goods, a bill paying station and a catch-all for other odds and ends.

In order to keep the space clutter-free, we installed two cabinets with retractable doors to store both the microwave and the television. The doors slide back to provide space while the appliances are in use, and keep everything out of sight when closed.

Creating Storage in Limited Space

problem

We widened the doorway to the bathing area, only leaving enough space for an 18" deep vanity. However, we couldn't recess a medicine cabinet on the back wall due to an obstruction.





solution

Because storage was important to the homeowner and a recessed medicine cabinet wasn't an option, we placed a mirror on the back wall and recessed a long, narrow medicine cabinet on the side wall. There was no loss of storage, and no bulky wall-hanging cabinetry taking up the space.
